At Brougham Primary School we are passionate about our children learning skills that can be practically used in the “real world”. The Modern Foreign Language curriculum will ensure it focuses on relatable and relevant skills that pupils will be able to put into practice, and give plenty of opportunities to hear, write and speak the language. There will be an important balance between the spoken and written, and we will ensure that children hear authentic examples of the language being spoken as well as modelled by the teacher.

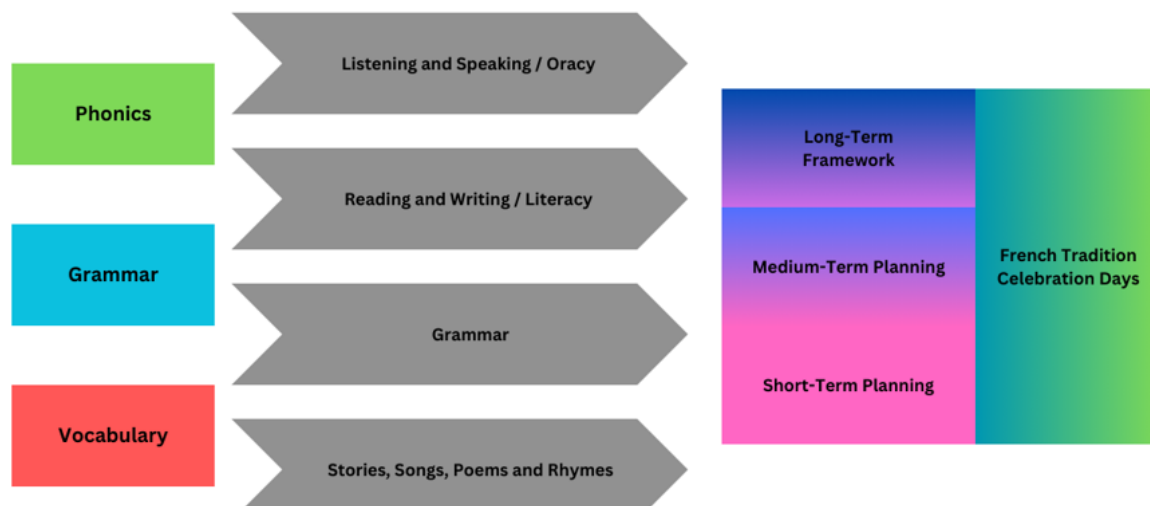


The MFL curriculum at Brougham Primary School (Implementation):


Brougham Primary School’s curriculum will ensure that all Key Stage 2 pupils:

- Understand and respond to spoken and written language from a variety of authentic sources
- Speak with increasing confidence, fluency and spontaneity, finding ways of communicating what they want to say, including through discussion and asking questions, and continually improving the accuracy of their pronunciation and intonation
- Can write at varying length for different purposes and audiences, using the variety of grammatical structures that they have learnt
- Discover and develop an appreciation of a range of writing in French
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MFL at Brougham Primary School is built around the building blocks of language which are phonics, grammar and vocabulary. The long-term framework has been adapted to ensure progression and each topic encompasses the national curriculum aims of listening and speaking, reading and writing, literature and grammar.

LKS2

In LKS2, Children will learn the basics of the French language. They will learn to greet each other, exchange names, ask how someone is, count to 10 and say how old they are. Children will learn key vocabulary and phrases around the theme of school and will learn to say the days of the week, months and dates, including their birthday, and also count on from 11 to 31. Children will learn the vocabulary for a range of food, to express likes and dislikes, and to count and use plural nouns. Children will learn how to identify and introduce family and pets and spell their names. They will also learn the names for places in their own home.

UKS2

In UKS2, Children will learn to develop their intercultural understanding by being introduced to the sights of some typical French cities. They will also learn to describe places in a town, count to 100 and give their address in French. Children will learn to develop their conversational skills via some new topics: transport, direction and movement. They will learn to conjugate the high-frequency verb 'to go' and use it in context. Children will learn about the shopping experience in France. Children will learn specific vocabulary of fruit, vegetables and clothes. They will learn key phrases for asking the questions needed when going shopping.

Enrichment



In school, children have access to a range of French language fictional stories that they can explore.








The Very Grizzly Day
