The adults in Brougham Primary School respect all children and help to protect your rights as children and keep you safe from harm.

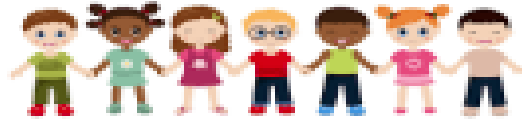

Our Safeguarding and Child Protection Policy helps everyone at Brougham Primary School to:

- Be protected.
- To decide what to do if there is a problem.
- To help find the support that is needed.

## • How do we protect you and keep you safe?

• Brougham Primary School is a school where everyone has the right to learn and to feel safe in school. We provide a learning environment so you can learn and play safely.

- We make sure you are safely looked after when you are in school and when you are at home.
- We help to make sure you do achieve your best, grow and develop properly.
- We make sure you have the best life chances and grow up happy and successful.
- We teach you how to recognise risks in different situations and how to protect yourself and stay safe.
- We teach you to know where to get help if you are worried or unhappy about something.

## • What do you do if you have a worry or a concern?

All the adults at Brougham Primary School have a responsibility to make sure that you are safeguarded and protected from harm.

You can talk to any of the adults in school if you have a worry or a concern about:

- Someone bullying you, or someone else.
- Others saying things that you do not like, that upset you or make you feel uncomfortable.
- Someone touching you in a way that makes you feel uncomfortable.
- Being hit or hurt by another person.
- Receiving messages or someone sending or saying unkind things over the internet, phone, tablet or when you are gaming.

We have a team of adults who lead the safeguarding of children in school. They support, listen and offer guidance to the adults and children in Brougham Primary School.

The Safeguarding Team has 2 Designated Safeguarding Leads (Mrs Greenan and Miss Illingworth), 2 Deputy Safeguarding Leads (Mrs Kelly and Mrs Carroll-Gardner & Mrs Bestford), a teacher for Children in Our Care (Miss Rogers), a teacher who is the Senior Mental Health Lead (Mrs Carroll-Gardner) and the safeguarding Governor (Mrs Sild).

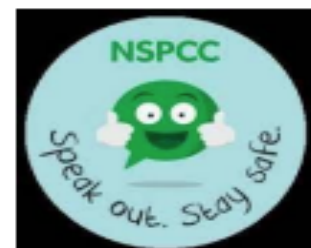
