Year 3 Spring Term 2 Newsletter

During Spring Term 2, in English, Year 3 pupils will explore Michael Murpurgo's, 'Baewulf' and use it to help them to write for a range of purposes. In maths, pupils will be investigating parallel and perpendicular lines, as well as learning how to recognise, name & describe common 2-D and 3-D shapes. They will also be recalling and using multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 multiplication tables and using these to solve problems. Their geography topic will be rainforests. The Science topic for Spring 2 is 'Sound'. In Art, pupils will explore surface, colour and still life. Year 3 will complete a computing unit in which they will learn how to program using Scratch. In RE, they will explore why Lent such an important period for Christians. Pupils will be learning dance and playground games in PE and in RSHE, pupils will be exploring the theme of citizenship.

TRAFFIC LIGHT ZONE



RED ZONE

All pupils whose attendance falls below 90% will be considered for legal monitoring by the Local Authority



AMBER ZONE

Those pupils who have fallen between 91%-96% are in the Amber Zone. Those in this zone are automatically monitored by school.



GREEN ZONE

All pupils whose attendance is 97% and above are part of the green zone. As Green a pupil you are more likely to achieve.

School Uniform

Please ensure that your child wears full school uniform each day for school.

Home Learning and Reading at Home

Home learning helps pupils to embed the knowledge they have learnt each week. We would be grateful if you could support and encourage your child to return their weekly homework.

Homework will be set on a **Friday** and must be completed and returned on a **Thursday**.

For children unable to access the internet, paper copies are always available - parents must inform class teacher if these are required.

Homework activities:

- 15 minute daily timetables using Timestable Rockstars
- 15 minutes per day home reading
- Your child may be provided with additional homework, where necessary.

Reading at home

Reading records are sent home on a Friday and must be returned to school Thursday of the following week. Your child is encouraged to read at least three times a week with an adult, who should then comment and sign the reading record on each of the three occasions.

Children who read at least three times per week will be awarded a Golden Ticket. Every time your child earns a Golden Ticket, their name is entered into a monthly draw to win a new reading book and certificate.

Please encourage your child to read as regularly as possible.

PE

Your child's PE day for **Spring 2** is **Wednesday**

All pupils must wear a **school PE kit** which consists of a red crew neck t-shirt & black shorts or black joggers. On colder days, red school jumpers are permitted to be worn over the top of their PE kit.
